

Its operations ranged from anti-submarine and convoy escort patrols including the sinking of U-97, to low level anti-shipping strikes and formation raids on strongly defended land targets; an excellent history, new, A\$70.

He was killed when his Beaufort bomber crashed into the Indian Ocean near Perth on 6 Jan 1944. <i>He was CO of #14 Sqn out of Pearce at the time. Learmonth Airbase at Exmouth is named for him,* vg cond, **A\$38**.

Vol1 & Vol2.** Kookaburra Technical Publications, Melbourne, 1989. 1st ed, sell as pair only, large 4to in d/w, profusely illus in colour, index, biblio, ***the most authorative reference in this field*, vg cond and hard to find as a pair, **A\$170.**

(10363) Treadwell, Terry C. and Wood, Alan C. **German Knights of the Air 1914-1918: The Holders of the Orden Pour le Merit.** Brassey's, London, 1997. 1st English ed, small 4to in protected d/w, inscription in prelims, profusely illustrated in b/w, glossary, biblio, index, pp208, **81 *German pilots won the Blue Max in WW1. There are 81 biographies of the recipients listed here*, vg cond, **A\$45.**

233/17. (10412) Wallace, Gordon. **"Up in Darwin with the Dutch" A Tribute to the Mitchell Bomber Boys.** Author, Victoria, 1983. A revised ed of "Are you there Don R?", 4to in card covers, signed by the author, numbered ed (#1362) profusely illustrated, some hi-lighting in text, nominal roll, pp180, ***being the true story of 18 Sqn NEI/RAAF forces from 1942 to 1950. The everyday life of its airmen in the air war in Darwin as compiled from the scrap books of a despatch rider who served with the sqn for 18 months, good cond and scarce, A\$45.*

As WW1 commenced and bogged down on the Western Front a need for secret intelligence was accepted and the Secret Intelligence Service was born (later became M16). Intrepid adventurers such as T.E. Lawrence etc flocked to join, new, A\$25.

(6301) Hesketh, Roger. **Fortitude: The D-Day Deception Campaign.** St Ermin's Press/Little, Brown & Co, London, 1999. 1st ed, thick 8vo in d/w, plates, maps and charts, appendices, index, pp513, **behind the success of D-Day was the most sphisticated deception scheme ever devised. The object was to persuade the enemy that the long-awaited landings would take place in the Pas-de-Calais, vg cond, **A\$34.**

(9892) Lasmar, Paul. **Spy Flights of the Cold War.** Sutton Publishing, UK, 1996. 1st ed, large 8vo in laminated boards, ex lib, plates & map, appendices, chapter notes, biblio, index, pp244, **the full story of the Cold War's secret but very real war in which hundreds of combatants lost their lives. Long before Gary Powers was shot down in his U2 in 1960, an undeclared war was being fought in the stratosphere, good cond, A\$26.

233/24. (11072) Masterman, J.C. **The Double-Cross System.** The Folio Society, London, 2007 (fp1972). Reprint, large 8vo in slipcase, portrait of Masterman in frontis, plates, appendices, index, pp215, ***Masterman ran his XX* (*Double Cross*) *Committee which had the job of turning captured German spies back against Hitler. He was very successful at it. The majority agreed and those who did not were hanged in Wormwood Scrubs prison*, vg cond, **A\$48**.

(10830) Matthews, Owen. **An Impeccable Spy: Richard Sorge, Stalin's Master Agent.** Bloomsbury, London, 2019. 1st ed, large trade 8vo in card covers, plates, chapter notes, biblio, index, pp435, ***Richard Sorge was a renowned Russian spy who infiltrated the highest eschalons of German, Chines and Japanese society just before and including WW2., new,* **A\$32.**

(10210) McGeough, Paul. **Kill Khalid: Mossad's Failed Hit and the Rise of Hamas.** Allen & Unwin, Sydney, 2009. 1st ed, trade 8vo in card covers, plates and map, chronology, chapter notes, index, pp477, **an account of one of the most bizarre assassination attempts in recent history. The target was Khalid Mishal, the political head of Hamas. The attempt failed and Mossad was blamed. A murky story, vg cond, **A\$24.**

(6571) Pujol, Juan & West, Nigel. **Operation GARBO: The Personal Story of the Most Successful Double Agent of World War 2.** Random House, NY, 1985. 1st US ed, 8vo in d/w, ex lib (messy prelims), plates, appendix, pp205, **known as GARBO to the Allies and ARABEL to the Germans, Pujol was an extraordinarily successful spy. He was decorated by both sides but it was his efforts that convinced Hitler the Allied invasion would centre on the Pas-de-Calais region, fair cond, A\$20.

(10833) Purnell, Sonia. **A Woman of No Importance: The Untold Story of Virginia Hall, WW2's Most Dangerous Spy.** Virago Press, London, 2019. 1st ed, trade 8vo in card covers, plates, list of agents names, chapter notes, biblo, index, pp399, ***in* 1942 the Gestapo would stop at nothing to track down the mysterious 'Limping Lady' who was fighting for the freedom of France. She was Virginia Hall, a glamorous American with a wooden leg who was the first woman to infiltrate Vichy France for SOE, new, **A\$35.**

(2420) Quirk, John Patrick et al. **The Central Intelligence Agency: A Photographic History.** Foreign Intelligence Press, 1986. 1st ed, 4to in d/w and mylar, fully illus in colour and b/w, index, pp256, ***traces the origins of the CIA and it's roots in the OSS of WW2, very useful (but now out of date) reference,* vg cond, **A\$28.**

233/30. (4548) Stevenson, William. **A Man Called INTREPID: The Secret War.** The Lyons Press, USA, 2000 (fp1976). Reprint, trade 8vo in card covers, plates, index, pp486, ***the authentic account of the most significant secret diplomacy and decisive intelligence operations of World War 2, vg cond,* **A\$22.**

233/31. (9537) Wynne, Barry. **Count Five and Die: 'D' Day Deception: The True Story of 'Operation Stampede'.** Souvenir Press, London, 1958. 1st ed, 8vo in bright complete d/w (now protected), plates, pp179, **the story of the fantastic gamble to convince the *Germans that the Allies would invade through Holland, the short-cut to Germany. An example of SOE and OSS working together; excellent stuff!* vg cond and uncommon, **A\$38**.

(9577) Wynne, Greville. **The Man From Odessa.** Robert Hale, London, 1981. 1st ed, large 8vo in d/w, plates, pp225, **master spy Greville Wynne tells the whole story of his career as a British secret agent up to the time of his capture in Russia and his trial and imprisonment in the Lubyanka over the Penkovsky affair. He was exchanged for the traitor Gordon Lonsdale, Le Carre stuff in the flesh, vg cond, A\$26.

233/33. (9894) Conant, Jennet. A Covert Affair: Julia Child & Paul Child in the OSS. Simon & Schuster, NY, 2011. 1st ed, large 8vo in d/w, plates, chapter notes, index, pp395, **the remarkable Julia Child who we all thought was a goumet chef but this was a cover for her work as an agent in the OSS (forerunner to the CIA), vg cond, A\$30.

(1615) Ayris, Cyril. **Squadron Leader Robert Milton, MC: The Man Who Stayed Behind.** PK Print, Perth, 1994. 1st ed, 8vo in card covers, signed by the author, plates and illus, pp165, ***Robert Milton was a WW2 flying ace (Spitfires and Mustangs), shot down over France & whose exploits with the French Underground would make him one of the few airmen to be awarded the Military Cross - a rivetting story, vg cond, A\$28.*

(11061) Brune, Peter. **Ralph Honner: Kokoda Hero.** A&U, Sydney, 2007 (fp2000 as We Band of Brothers). 1st ed in this format, trade 8vo in card covers, plates and maps, chapter notes, biblio, index, pp354, ***the indefatigable Ralph Honner, who led a battalion of barely trained CMF soliers against the Japs on the Kokoda Track. They did terrible damage to the forward elements of the Japanese attackers*, vg cond, **A\$36.**

(6961) Callwell, Major-General Sir C.E., KCB. **Field-Marshall Sir Henry Wilson, Bart, GCB, DSO: His Life and Diaries (in two volumes).** Cassell & Co, London, 1927. 2nd impr, thick 8vo in green cloth, gilt titles and monogram on covers, inscr in fep, plates, (portrait in fep in both vols - loose in vol 1), index (in vol 2), pp364 & 390, **Henry Wilson joined the British Army in 1885 but his diary don't commence till 1893. Thereafter they are a comple diary of the Field-Marshall's long career, vg cond, **A\$60**.

Reprint, 8vo in card covers, plates, chapter notes, biblio, index, pp196, **Albert Jacka, 14th Bn, AIF, was awarded the VC on Gallipoli (the first Australian to do so). He was later awarded the Military Cross at Pozieres and a Bar to the MC at Bullecourt on the Western Front, a good biography of a serious soldier,, vg cond, A\$28.

His career spanned forty years including two world wars, Japan occupation and the Korean War, an important contribution to military biography, vg cond, A\$45.

(1125) Hetherington, John. **Blamey: Controversial Soldier: A Biography of Field-Marshall Sir Thomas Blamey, GBE, KCB, CMG, DSO, ED.** AWM, Canberra, 1973. 1st ed, large 8vo in bumped d/w (now protected), plates, index, biblio, pp414, ***the author, who wrote the first bio of Blamey, found there was much he didn't know about him and thus, was compelled to write 'controversial soldier', an excellent book.* good cond, **A\$36**.

233/42. (7595) Hibberd, Dominic. **Wilfred Owen: A New Biography.** Weidenfeld & Nicholson, Lobndon, 2002. 1st ed, large 8vo in d/w, plates and maps, appendices, biblio, index, pp424, **the war poet Wilfred Owen was Killed in Action in 1918 aged 25. Only 5 of his poems had been published. Yet he became one of the most popular poets of the 20th century. Here then is the full story of his short life, vg cond, A\$42.

(10984) Jackson, Robert. **Douglas Bader: A Biography.** Arthur Baker, London, 1983. 1st ed, large 8vo in protected d/w, plates, index, pp170 ***the amazing Douglas Bader who lost both legs in WW2. When he recovered and, fitted with prosthetic legs, went right back to flying Spitfires. He was shot down and encarcerated in Colditz prison and, because he was always trying to escape, they confisca ed his legs, what a man*!! Vg cond, **A\$36.**
